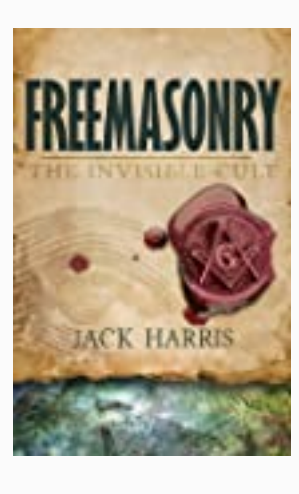
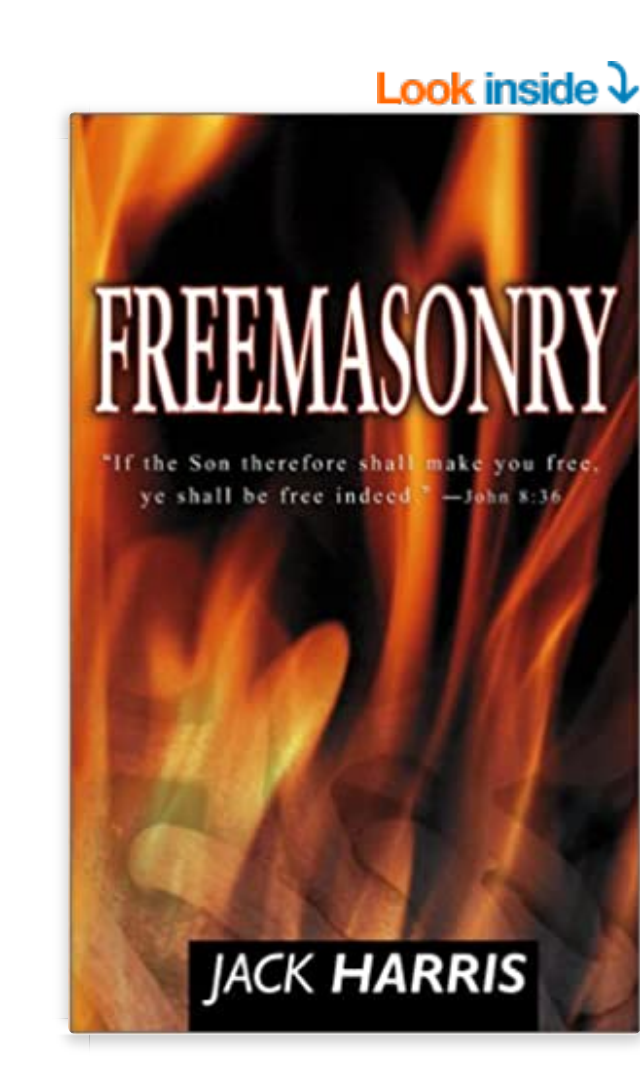

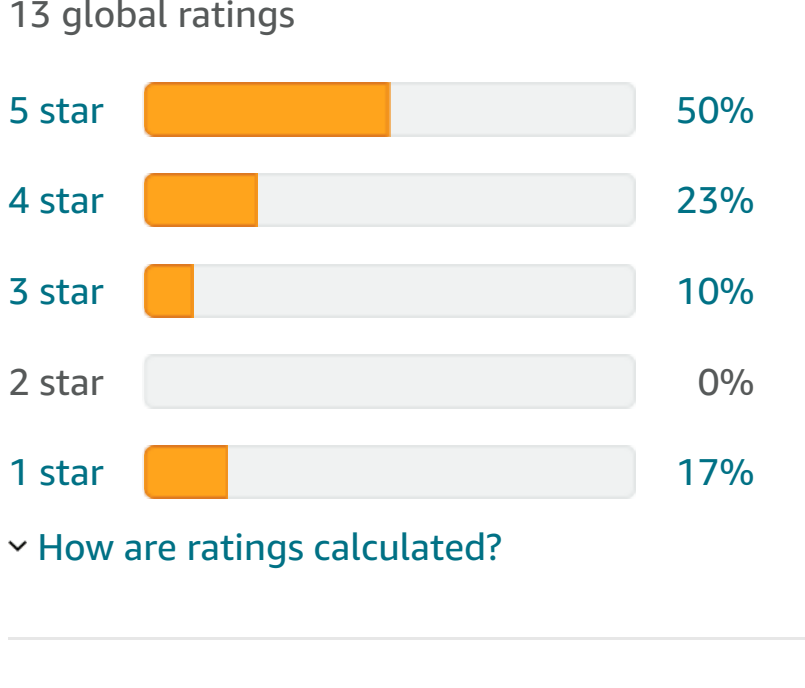

 I am a Christian who holds to the five fundamentals of the faith. I am grieved and disappointed that this kind of misinterpretation is taking place among Bible-believing Christians. After reading a few titles along this same line, I see a correlation between believers who insist upon taking everything literally and anti-Masonic rhetoric. Freemasonry is full of allegories and symbolism, a point this author refuses to acknowledge. There is also an absence here of acknowledging that Freemasonry operates on general, not special, revelation.

If you're looking for a good, sound critique of Freemasonry, this one isn't it. Freemasonry isn't perfect by any means, but it also isn't occultic. I recommend "Born in Blood" by Robinson or "The Meaning of Masonry" by Wilimhurst as much more reputable titles.

 My review will not show as a verified purchase because I did not purchase it from Amazon. I read the book many years ago and I found that Mr. Harris' book agreed with other exposés on Freemasonry. There are many one star reviews about this book but you must realize those reviews are written by people who are still Freemasons. That means they're still under deception and self-deception. Ask any other cult member in any other major cult whether or not they agree with the same expose written by a former member and of course they will tell you what a terrible expose it was. The expose pattern of research can be seen over and over by a multiplicity of authors that the author of the Scottish Rite degrees, Albert Pike, was a Luciferian, a "theology" which is diabolically counter-Biblical. I tried to look up Harris' citations, but found them so obscure, I wonder if any actually exist, as they can't be found in old card catalogs, or stored in any old archives. From this, I ran across a review by Wayne E. Sirmon, from 1999, and found that he had the same problems, but did find a few, one the same as I. Below, I quote Mr. Sirmon:

"My efforts to obtain copies of Mr. Harris' references were for the most part unsuccessful. Even though I consider myself well-read in Masonic literature, I did not recognize the majority of the "well-known Masonic authorities." After searching the National Union Catalog of Pre-1956 Imprints, I discovered the following information about some of the sources of Mr. Harris' "facts."

"J. D. Buck has 20 citations, including five Masonic, five psychology, three dealing with homeopathy (A
